Parent Corner

Student's Use of Technology at Home

Many students particularly in the older grades have access to technology (cell phones, Ipads, tablets, Ipods, laptops). There are many ways that students can connect with others using these devices. Please ensure that you are aware of what your children are doing on their devices, and who they are communicating with. All students should be monitored, but especially our younger students who do not understand how to communicate using these types of devices and websites.

To monitor your child's social media usage at home we suggest the following:

- Ensure that you have access to your child's social media (Snapchat, Instagram, Facebook, Text messages, Youtube). The students are young and may not use them appropriately.
- 2. Ensure that girls have only girls on their social media and boys have only boys. We have situations where girls and boys are chatting on social media and we want to ensure that parents are aware and monitor those relationships as they are not allowed in the school.
- 3. If students are playing on-line games, please read to see the age level of the game. We have students as young as grade 2 playing games that should only be played by adults age 18+ due to graphic content and language.
- 4. Make sure you or your child know their contacts on social media personally. There have been situations where children believe they are talking to someone they know, but it is not the case.
- Privacy Settings Check to ensure your child's privacy is at the highest security.
- 6. It is suggested that all electronics be removed from your child's room prior to sleep. This will ensure that

your child is going to sleep on time and receiving an adequate amount of sleep. Below is information
regarding required sleep for children:
Children 3 to 5 years - 10 to 13
hours of sleep every 24 hours
(including naps).
Children 6 to 12 years - 9 to 12
hours of sleep every 24 hours.
Teens 13 to 18 years - 8 to 10
hours of sleep every 24 hours.

- 7. If your child is experiencing negative interactions on social media, do not allow access.
- 8. Ensure your child us using devices in a common area of your home so that you are able to monitor what they are doing.

Children and young adults do not have the maturity and decision-making skills to handle most social media. It is suggested to check your child's device (s) daily. It is also suggested to not allow access until the students are older and can manage using social media.

Regina Huda School wants students to focus on their faith and school work as well as developing positive relationships with their peers. We will continue to work together to educate and assist children with appropriate use of their devices.
