Students' Use of Social Media



Although most students' use of social media occurs at home, we see some negative effects at school including cheating on assignments, using offensive language, and bullying. Parents must monitor their children's use of social media and help to teach their children how to be responsible and respectful. Here are some tips:

1. Follow age limit requirements. Most social media sites require users to be at least 13, 14, or 15 years old. Younger children should not have Facebook, Twitter, or Snapchat accounts. As parents, you may decide to set the age limit in your household to be higher than that.

2. *Keep devices in common areas of your home.* All computers, tablets, and smartphones should be used and stored in the kitchen or living room so that you can adequately monitor your children's use. This applies to teenagers as well as younger children.

3. *Set guidelines and rules*. Your child needs to know what acceptable behaviour is and what it is not. Your child must also know that they need to tell you if their contacts are breaking the rules.

4. *Monitor what your child is doing*. Look at what your child is sending, receiving, and viewing so that you are completely aware of their online behaviour.

5. *Teach your child to be proud of what she posts.* Let your child know that she should be proud to show you everything she has posted. If she cannot be proud of it, she should not post it.

Social media has many positive effects, but we want your children to be safe and respectful, so please monitor and teach your children at home and we will continue to do the same at school.
